4. Artificial Intelligence for Language Teaching

Who is this course for?

This course is aimed at language teachers, teacher trainers, and education professionals who wish to explore how artificial intelligence can enhance language teaching. It is particularly suitable for those seeking to design interactive and personalised learning experiences, streamline lesson preparation, and integrate innovative digital tools into their classroom practice.

What you will learn

Participants will gain an understanding of the fundamentals of AI and its applications in education, learning how to create exercises, quizzes, and learning materials with AI tools. They will discover methods for generating personalised feedback, integrating AI-powered translation, summarisation, and conversation tools into lessons, and combining these innovations with traditional teaching approaches. The course will also address ethical considerations and the responsible use of AI in educational contexts.

Training contents

The training includes an introduction to AI concepts relevant to language teaching, an overview of AI-powered platforms and applications for education, and hands-on practice in creating AI-generated vocabulary, grammar, and comprehension activities. Participants will learn to design speaking and writing tasks with AI assistance, use chatbots for role plays and conversation practice, analyse student data to personalise learning paths, and develop a sustainable integration plan for their own teaching contexts. Special attention will be given to addressing biases, ethics, and privacy issues in AI use.

Tangible outputs

By the end of the course, participants will have developed a set of AI-generated lesson plans and activities, a digital toolkit of recommended AI tools for language teachers, and sample chatbot conversation scripts ready for classroom use. Each participant will also leave with a

personalised plan for integrating AI into their teaching practice and will receive a certificate of completion.
